# Using the internet

### Practise activity:

- 1. Click in the address bar, where it says **www.learnmyway.com**.
- 2. Delete www.learnmyway.com type www.gov.uk then press Enter.
- 3. When the website has loaded, look on the right hand side, below the blue band, for a link to the **Money and tax** section. Select the link.
- 4. When the Money and tax section has loaded, look down the main list in the centre of the screen and select **Court claims, debt and bankruptcy**. A new menu will appear to the right.

- 5. From the new menu, look down the menu for a link about **options for dealing with your debts**. Select the link.
- 6. Find and select the link to the Money Advice Service.
- 7. Find the **Debt & Borrowing** section at the top of the screen, then select the **Debt Advice Locator**.
- 8. Open one of the websites listed under the Online debt advice services section.
- 9. Make a note of the website you've got to.
